



Midway Polled Herefords is a sixth-generation family farm and ranch that began in 1910. My dad, Doug Smith, founded our registered Polled Hereford herd in 1953, and my mom Ann is still an active part of the ranch.

Our goal is to produce big, rugged 2-yearold-bulls and raise them with longevity and survivability in mind. We only select the top one-third of the bull calves from our 200 registered cows. We also produce replacement heifers that grow into big-volume, high-producing cows. We begin selling bulls by private treaty in January and replacement heifers in February. A yearly catalog is available upon request by mail or online.



We also have 170 commercial cows consisting of Hereford and black Angus ge-


netics. These cows produce a large group of black baldy replacement heifers that are offered for sale yearly.



Welcome to the 2021 North Dakota Stockmen's Association's All Breeds Cattle Tour and to Spickler Ranch North!

Spickler Ranch North is a third-and fourth-generation purebred Angus seedstock operation. Justin and Sara Spickler own and operate Spickler North along with our four children Wyatt, 16; Will, 15; Jessa, 12; and Watson, 11. We truly are a family operation, with each family member having specific jobs and tasks that contribute to our success.

Our cowherd consists of 600-plus spring-calving cows, along with a group

of fall-calving cows. We hold an annual production sale each November, when we offer coming 2-year-old bulls, bred heifers and bred cows. The most recent addition to our sale offering are commercial heifers purchased from our customers, freeze branded, artificially inseminated and developed by us. In 2012, with the help of the NDSA, we built a 999-head feedlot. We use the feedlot for sale cattle development and to finish nearly all of the cattle that we cull. In turn, we market them directly to a packing plant. This task and the end result give us tremendous insight into how our cattle perform in the feedlot and at the plant.

Spickler Ranch North also owns a small band of Quarter Horse mares. We have been Quarter Horse breeders since 1988. Our bloodlines include Doc Bar, Poco Bueno, King, Cutter Bill and, our current stud purchase from the Eslinger operation in Ashley, a red roan Peptoboonsmal-bred horse.



Jallo Angus Ranch originally started as a 4-H project in 1974, when Darrell purchased his first Angus heifer. As Darrell expressed an interest in the seedstock industry, he went to work for Earl Hofstad of Ramsey Angus of

Starkweather and later purchased 40 head of registered Angus females from Hofstad. These females were the original foundation of the Jallo Angus Ranch herd. Today, the ranch has developed into a multi-generational operation. The Jallo family includes Darrell's parents, Harold and Carol, wife Deb, and their children Jamie (husband Erik and son Emmett), Jessica (husband Taylor and sons Orrin and Jasper) and Jason, who works alongside Darrell on the ranch.

The herd consists of 350 Angus mother cows. Jallo Angus Ranch has an extensive artificial insemination and embryo transfer program that allows them to improve genetics through the raising of females and herd bulls, as well as the purchase of high-quality bulls that complement their program. The ranch has embraced DNA genomic Expected Progeny Differences (EPDs). All stock is fed and bulls are developed on the ranch. In addition, anything that goes to market is finished on site. Jallo Angus Ranch hosts an annual production sale on the third Sunday in January. The 43rd annual sale will be held on Jan. 16, 2022, and will feature approximately 80 fall- and spring-born bulls and a select group of bred and open females.

Always striving to improve their breeding program, Jallo Angus Ranch's mission is to breed for functional cattle that cover everything from eye appeal, carcass quality, performance and longevity. They strive to stay true to their breeding program goals and raise cattle that go out and work, whether that's in the pasture, feedlot or even in the showring.

Jallo Angus Ranch also runs a farming operation comprised of wheat, corn, edible beans, soybeans and oats near Fordville.

BINA CHAROLAIS

Welcome to the All Breeds Cattle Tour!

Bina Charolais is a seventh-generation family farm that originated in 1896. The farm consists of Lane and Vicki and their daughters Desiree, Deitra, Denae (husband Kyle and daughters Kennedy, Gentry and Brinkley) Stern and Derissa (husband Dustin and son Ian) LaFleur.

In 1979, two bachelors offered their checkbook to Lane to buy seven Cha-



rolais cows and pay them back when he had the money. This transaction started the Bina Charolais registered herd, as well as a relationship that grew. Lane eventually bought out their Charolais herds.

Today, the herd consists of 90 purebred Charolais and 30 red-factor Charolais spring-calving cow-calf pairs. We do an extensive 30-day artificial insemination, with natural heat detection. This helps us to improve our genetics in order to produce high-quality individuals to sell to our customers. We also keep back 10 to 15 replacement heifers a year to improve the genetics of our herd. Fifteen years ago, we started in the red-factor Charolais to give our bull customers an opportunity to keep their black and red hides, while getting the extra pounds and muscle that Charolais put into their offspring. We also sell a handful of show heifers, which have been successful around the country, and replacement heifers. We look for our heifers to go to our customers and be sound and functional, while offering strong maternal traits.

We host our annual Bina Charolais Powerhouse Bull Sale the third Tuesday in February. Our 27th annual sale will be Feb. 15, 2022, in Jamestown. We sell our top 30 to 35 bulls, the ones we feel have the ability to meet our customers' requirements of adding pounds, muscle and profit in their pocket. One of our favorite sayings is, "We won't sell it to you if we wouldn't use it ourselves." Our bull sale has been ranked in the top 10 Charolais bull sales in the nation for the last 10 years. In 2007, we won the pen-of-three bulls at the National Western Stock Show in Denver, Colo.


Besides raising Charolais cattle, we raise wheat, canola, oats, corn and pinto beans.







Nelson Angus would like to welcome everyone to the 2021 North Dakota Stockmen's Association's All Breeds Cattle Tour.

Nelson Angus was started in 1961 by Otto and Sharon Nelson with the purchase of three cows and a bull from Clyde Bark's Snorest Angus Farm. Additional females and herdsires were then selected from the Henry Kruger herd in Killarney, Manitoba, Canada, and other top-producing herds through various sales, such as the North Dakota Winter Show and North Dakota Angus Association sales. A large percentage of our present-day cowherd still traces back to these foundation genetics at least once. From the early beginning, Nelson Angus has been a family affair, with all five of Otto's and Sharon's children being involved, working on the ranch and competing in 4-H, FFA and junior activities.

In 1997, Otto and Sharon handed over the management and control of the day-to-day operations of the Nelson Angus cowherd to two of their sons, Mike and Dan. Since then, we have been utilizing some of the newest technologies available to the livestock industry, as well as adding some top new genetics to the Nelson herd the through purchase of live animals, semen and embryos from some of the top herds across the country.

Currently, we run about 150 mother cows and approximently 35 replacement heifers a year. We calve from February to April. We use artifical insemination technology for more than 75 percent of the cowherd and all of the replacement heifers before turning them out on grass pasture with our top-notch herdsires.

We primarily market our genetics through two sales each year. In November, we will proudly be part of the 9th annual Pearls of the Prairie Angus Sale at Kist Livestock in Mandan, where we will be offering our top show heifer prospects and a powerful set of bred heifers.

On March 12, 2022, we will be hosting our 19th annual production sale at the ranch 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ miles north of Egeland in our heated sale facility. We will offer a powerful set of approximently 35 bulls, as well as select groups of heifer calves and bred heifers.

We would like to thank you for stopping by our ranch and for attending the tour. We hope that next time you are in the area you stop by. We are always ready to talk cattle.



From those original heifers, the McCumber cowherd was built. Today, a majority of the cowherd will trace to two of those original females.

They are represented by the Miss Wix and Rosetta cow families, which are now recognized throughout the Angus breed.


For 57 years, the focus of our breeding program has been to build and maintain a top cowherd that is efficient, fertile, productive and problem-free. We focus on breeding cattle that will work in a forage environment and not only survive, but thrive. We breed cattle with the commercial cow-calf producer in mind. We are thankful for the opportunity to do what we love and look forward to the future of the beef industry and the Angus business in the years to come. 
They market approximently 130 bulls in the sale and roughly 70 bred heifers. The sale is held the second Saturday of February at the ranch.

MIDWAY POLLED HEREFORDS

From the Fireside Inn in Devils Lake, head south on ND-20 S to St. Michael for 8.5 miles. Take BIA Road 20 and Brown Road to 29th Street NE for 11.5 miles. Go approximately five miles on 76th Avenue NE to 76th Street NE. Head west for one mile to the ranch headquarters.

TOPP ANGUS

From Midway Polled Herefords, travel east for approximately one mile until 76th Avenue NE. Continue on for seven miles until turning left onto ND-15 E. Head another seven miles. Head south onto 83rd Avenue NE for one mile before continuing on 82nd Avenue NE for approximately four miles. Turn left onto 14th Street NE to the ranch headquarters.

SPICKLER RANCH NORTH

Head west on 14th Street NE towards 82nd Avenue NE. Turn left at the first cross street onto 82nd Avenue NE and continue on for nearly seven miles, through Grace City. Turn left onto 7th Street NE for one mile before continuing north on 83rd Avenue for half a mile. Turn right and continue for one mile to the ranch headquarters.

JALLO ANGUS RANCH

Take 85th Avenue NE and 11st Street NE to ND-20 N in McHenry. Turn left onto ND-20 N and continue for 16 miles. Turn right onto ND-15 E and travel for 13 miles before continuing on ND-1 N. Then, turn onto U.S. Highway 2 and head east for 22 miles. At the junction of ND-32 N, head north for approximately 14 miles. Head west on 55th Street NE for 5.5 miles. The ranch headquarters will be on the north side of the road.

From Grassy Meadow Ranch, head south on ND-35 S to Michigan. Turn right onto U.S. Highway 2 and continue on for 36 miles. The tour headquarters will be on the right side of the road.

Tuesday, Oct. 5, 2021

LAZY W ANGUS RANCH

Head west on U.S. Highway 2 for nearly 20 miles. Turn right into Churchs Ferry and head north on U.S. Highway 281 for approximately 18 miles. Turn left onto 77th Street NE and head to the ranch headquarters.

NELSON ANGUS

Head east to U.S. Highway 281. Continue north for seven miles. Turn right onto ND-66 E and travel for five miles. Turn left onto 72nd Avenue NE and continue for 1.5 miles to the ranch headquarters.

MCCUMBER ANGUS RANCH

Head out of the yard and turn right onto ND 66-W. Continue for twenty-five miles. Turn left to stay on ND-66 W and keep traveling for nearly 12 miles. Then, turn left onto 37th Avenue. The ranch headquarters are located on the west side of the road.

GURR LAKE ANGUS

Head out of the yard and north on 37th Avenue towards ND-66 W. Turn left at the first cross street onto ND-66 W and continue west for one mile. Turn right onto 36th Avenue NE and travel for two miles. The ranch headquarters will be on the right.

KENNER SIMMENTAL RANCH

Head out of the yard and southeast on 36th Avenue NE towards 88th Street NE for two miles. Turn right onto ND-66 W and continue on for 7 miles. Turn left onto ND-3 S and travel for 23 miles. Then, turn left onto U.S. Highway 2 and continue on for 27 miles. Turn onto 55th Avenue NE at Leeds and travel for approximately three miles. Turn left on 57th Street NE and the ranch will be located on the south side of the road.

FIRESIDE INN

From Kenner Simmental Ranch, head east on 57th Street NE before turning left onto 59th Avenue NE and travel for three miles. Turn right onto U.S. Highway 2 and continue on for 27 miles. The tour headquarters will be on the left side of the road.
